#### REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS: LEGAL SERVICES PROVIDER

#### I. INTRODUCTION

This document is a request by the Lake George Park Commission (hereafter the Commission) for proposals from attorneys or firms of attorneys (hereafter the Firm) admitted at the Bar to practice law in New York State to provide general, special and enforcement related legal services to the Commission for a period of 5 years beginning November 1, 2019 and ending October 31, 2024.

Firms wishing to submit proposals in response to this request do so entirely at their own expense. There is no expressed or implied obligation upon the Commission to reimburse responding firms for any expenses they may incur in preparing proposals, attending the bidder conference or answering this request.

Submission of a proposal indicates acceptance of the conditions contained in the request for proposal, unless clearly and specifically noted otherwise in the proposal submitted. The terms and conditions set forth herein and the presentations in the selected proposal shall form the basis for the agreement between the Firm and the Commission. The Commission reserves the right to reject any or all proposals submitted in response to the request.

To be considered, five copies of a proposal must be received by mail, parcel post or personal delivery at the Commission office, 75 Fort George Road, P.O. Box 749, Lake George, New York 12845 not later than **3:00pm on Monday, June 17, 2019**. Facsimile transmittals will not be accepted. The submissions become the property of the Lake George Park Commission subject to the Freedom of Information Law.

Announcement of the award is expected to be made on Tuesday, June 25, 2019 with the contract fully executed on or before October 31, 2019. Work would commence only upon approval of the contract by the NYS Attorney General and the Office of the State Comptroller in accordance with the State Finance Law.

#### II. BACKGROUND

#### The Commission

The Lake George Park Commission and the Lake George Park are established by Article 43 of the Environmental Conservation Law (McKinney's). The Commission consists of nine citizen members appointed by the Governor, by and with advice and consent of the Senate and the Environmental Conservation Commissioner ex-officio.

The purpose of the Commission is to preserve, protect, and enhance the unique natural and scenic resources of the Lake George Park which is comprised of Lake George and essentially all public and private lands draining thereto. The Commission administers rules and regulations relating to boats and navigation on the lake, shoreline development projects such as docks, moorings and marinas and water quality protection controls such as wastewater and stormwater management.

#### **Responsibilities and Functions of the Commission**

The authority and responsibilities of the Commission are as follows:

- Administer the Lake George Park Trust Fund and operate a system for the collection of annual fees set by Article 43 for commercial and residential wharfs and for registration of vessels for use on Lake George.
- Operate the existing Lake George Park Commission Marine Patrol, a law enforcement and public safety function consisting of eight patrol units and operating seasonally beginning May 1 until the end of navigation season.
- Administer the existing Lake George Recreational Zone Regulations governing wharfs, moorings and docks. Develop, implement and administer rules and regulations relative to the permitting of boats, the setting of limits on speed and sound and the regulation of recreational activities, such as water skiing, regattas, boat rentals, parasailing and tour boats.
- Develop, implement and administer rules and regulations for the management of stormwater runoff in the Lake George watershed.
- Develop, implement and administer rules and regulations for effective stream corridor management to include standards for the location of roads, stream channelizations, timber harvesting and other activities within or near the hundreds of Lake George tributaries.
- Conduct environmental reviews of major or sensitive development projects as the lead agency pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act.
- Provide technical assistance to localities in the conduct of project reviews pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act.
- Continue the investigation and monitoring the presence of nuisance aquatic plants and develop and implement nuisance aquatic plant management and invasive species prevention programs.

- Conduct investigations, secure evidence, hold hearings, issue orders and bring actions in any court of jurisdiction for the abatement of any condition of pollution or the violation of any provision of Article 43 or rules and regulations issued pursuant thereto.
- Conduct scientific investigations and research into the lake's ecosystem and factors influencing the lake's health and vitality.
- Develop public information programs and coordinate public activities in order to promote the wise and effective use and conservation of Lake George.

#### III. OBJECTIVES

As a State regulatory and enforcement agency, the Commission needs to procure high quality, consistent, legal services on a regular and continuing basis.

To achieve this goal, several key objectives are evident:

- A. The Firm must provide competent experienced attorneys to provide advice and counsel in: public affairs, institutional arrangements, public employment, State environmental laws and regulations and prosecution of enforcement cases.
- B. Work must be provided on a consistent basis. Attorneys providing services must do so regularly, so as to provide continuity of legal policies and positions. Generally, a single attorney would provide for most or all of the general legal service needs and function as a liaison with other Firm members if required and applicable (primary provider).
- C. The Firm must be readily accessible. The Firm must take telephone conferences Monday thru Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. exclusive of legal holidays. Firms must provide measures to prevent prolonged interruptions in access to legal services due to court appearances, vacations, business, travel, etc. Telephone calls must be toll free to the Commission.
- D. Work must be provided on a timely basis. Firms must demonstrate the capacity to provide responses promptly.
- E. The attorney/Firm must be available to travel to locations of regular meetings of the Commission at their own expense. Travel time may be charged (at the regular hourly rate) for extended travel required. Such travel shall be approved in advance. There will be no reimbursement for meals.
- F. The attorney/Firm must have a business office with telephone and clerical support reasonably accessible to Lake George, New York. All legal services provided shall be completely supported with clerical and secretarial support. Typing, sorting, reproduction of documents shall be considered part of the legal services provided.
- G. Disbursements shall be limited to the actual cost to the Firm. Proposals shall specify disbursement rates but not to exceed the following:

Photocopying \$.10 per page

Mail Not to exceed actual postage

Telephone Charges Mileage Not to exceed actual toll charges Trips over 50 miles at the IRS standard mileage rates for business use.

Other disbursement rates shall be proposed. Unscheduled disbursements shall be reimbursed provided they are reasonable charges and necessary to the conduct of State business.

#### IV. THE NATURE AND SCOPE OF SERVICES PROVIDED

The legal services required fall into three broad categories: general, enforcement and special.

#### A. General

General legal service needs of the Commission require attorney time devoted to all of the following:

- Travel to and attendance at monthly meetings of the Commission at locations within the Lake George Park. Attendance at all monthly Commission meetings is required. Attendance at one or more regular monthly sub-committee meeting is often requested. Preparation for the meeting may include the review of agenda items, preparation of decision documents or written opinions. Attendance at Commission and sub-committee meetings often involves the presentation of oral advice and counsel on matters being deliberated.
- The review of written materials and preparation of written decisions of the Commission including: Resolutions, Final Orders and Determinations, permit conditions, Consent Orders, agreements and other instruments which set forth and implement those decisions.
- The consultation with and offering of advice to the Commission Chair and Commission staff between meetings of the Commission. This may include preparation of written and oral positions, attendance at meetings, interpretation of the Commission's regulations or their application to a certain set of facts, and regular advice on other State laws such as FOIL, SAPA, SEQRA, State Finance Law, Civil Service, etc.
- Conduct of legal research and the preparation of written opinions of counsel.
- Conduct of legal research and preparation of written materials, affidavits, memoranda of law in support of New York State Department of Law in matters of litigation against the Commission.
- Preparation of: contracts for the procurement of services; agreements between and among other government agencies; and memoranda of understanding among other departments of State government.
- Advice and counsel on legal and procedural requirements of the following laws: Freedom of Information Law, State Administrative Procedures Act, State Environmental Quality Review Act, State Finance Law.
- Representation of the Commission in contacts with other units of State and local governments and the Legislature.

 The review of proposed legislation, administrative or executive actions, the rendering of opinions thereon, presentation of opinions and positions in contacts with State officials, attendance at meetings in Albany or elsewhere across the State.

#### B. Enforcement

This role primarily involves the representation of the Commission in prosecuting administrative enforcement cases. Attorney time is required for the following elements:

- The review of case reports, interview of witnesses and review of regulations to develop a
  written notice of hearing and complaint for violation of one or more of the provisions of 6
  NYCRR 645 and 646.
- The representation of the Commission with respondents and their attorneys in criminal and administrative enforcement matters.
- The development of written settlements, orders on consent and related decision documents.
- The presentation of evidence before an Administrative Law Judge in administrative enforcement actions.
- The offering of advice and counsel in enforcement matters.
- The preparation of written decisions, orders, permits, stipulations, affidavits, memorandum and other documents in support of actions in enforcement matters of the Commission.

#### C. Special

This role may involve representation of the Commission in the process of filing and obtaining requisite permits for activities directly undertaken by the Commission, such as for aquatic plant management programs. This work, if required, might be characterized by periods of intensive hours of preparation of case materials and witnesses over several weeks of time. The special needs may also involve the development and promulgation of regulations pursuant to the State Administrative Procedures Act. Regulations proposed to be developed include rules for stream corridor, tree clearing, wastewater management and revised regulations governing stormwater management prepared in consultation and cooperation with various State and local agencies.

Specific tasks will include: advising the Commission on legal requirements pursuant to SEQRA and SAPA; review of Draft and Final Environmental Impact Statements, preparation and/or review of Regulatory Impact Statements and Regulatory Flexibility Analysis; and filing of regulatory and attendant documents in accordance with applicable procedures.

#### D. Anticipated Hours of Legal Services Required

A typical month requires approximately 20 hours of legal services time from the Commission's retained counsel, plus or minus 10 hours depending upon time of year and whether the Commission is engaged in a rule making effort. However, no minimum or maximum number of legal services hours is guaranteed under this agreement.

#### V. REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CONTRACT

- A. The Firm shall provide legal services through the primary provider on an uninterrupted basis beginning with the effective date of the contract for the complete term of the agreement.
- B. The Firm shall provide itemized statements of services no more frequently than 30 days and at least once every 90 days. Statements shall be sufficiently detailed to identify: the date of service, the Commission contact, the provider, attorney or paralegal, the time and a brief description of the matter.
- C. The Firm shall provide help and assistance to New York State Attorney General's Office as requested in support of litigation but shall not represent the State or Commission in litigation.
- D. The Firm shall make active measures to identify to the Commission those matters which may give the appearance of a conflict of interest between the Firm or any of its attorneys and any applicant, respondent, defendant or appellant to the Commission.
- E. All documents, opinions, reports and products of any form or nature produced under the contract are the property of the Lake George Park Commission and shall be returned in entirety to the Commission not later than thirty (30) days from the expiration of the agreement.
- F. The Firm shall maintain reasonable accessibility to the Commission staff by telephone at all times.
- G. The Firm shall respond to Commission requests and inquires promptly, at a minimum within 48 hours but may be afforded additional time to research extensive issues.
- H. The Firm shall participate in reasonable cost containment measures such as tracking and reporting unusually high expenses during the billing cycle.
- I. Work performed shall be done so only at the request of the Commission. Work shall not be commenced solely as a result of third party inquiries.
- J. The contract will include Appendix A "Standard Clauses for all New York State Contracts".
- K. The Commission may terminate the contract on thirty days' notice for failure to perform or for cause, as determined by the Commission.
- L. The contractor shall indemnify the Commission and its officers from liability for negligent actions of the contractor and shall maintain liability insurance during the term of the contract.
- M. The contractor shall annually certify that it is in compliance with New York State Tax Law Section 5-a, Contractor Certification Requirement and shall by November 1, of each year file a ST 220 TD with the NYS Dept. of Taxation.
- N. The Commission may cancel the contract at any time by giving the Firm thirty (30) days written notice. The Firm agrees to stop work immediately upon receipt of such notice and submit invoices for work performed up to the cancellation notice.

#### VI. COMMISSION'S RESERVED RIGHTS

The Commission reserves the right to:

- A. Define requirements to meet agency needs and to modify, correct and clarify requirements at any time during the process provided the changes are justified and that modifications would not materially benefit or disadvantage an offerer;
- B. Disqualify proposed solutions that fail to meet mandatory requirements;
- C. Eliminate mandatory requirements unmet by all offerers;

#### VII. GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR PROPOSALS

- A. The Firm shall provide five (5) copies of the proposal.
- B. The proposal submitted by the successful bidder will serve as the basis for a contract with the State of New York. Please refer to Appendix A General Conditions for all State Contracts attached.
- C. Each proposal shall state by name, position, and billable rate the attorney to be assigned as the primary provider of legal services to the Commission.
- D. Each proposal shall state by name, position and billable rate the additional legal and key support staff anticipated to provide services to the Commission.
- E. Each proposal shall include any relevant experience of the firm and resume of the primary provider that the firm wishes considered by the Commission in its review. Care should be taken to specify the role and experience of the primary provider relative to the Commission's needs.
- F. Each proposal shall include the offer's certification pursuant to State Finance Law, Subsection 139-D and 139-K(5). See attached forms.
- G. Each proposal shall contain a Vendor Responsibility Questionnaire as attached to the RFP or completed online at https://onlineservices.osc.state.ny.us
- H. Proposals shall be organized as follows:

#### **Technical Component**

- 1. Introduction
- 2. Organizational Information or Description of Firm
- 3. The resumes of the primary providers and any particulars as to how the services would be delivered.

#### A Separate Financial Component

- 1. A list of providers and hourly rates.
- 2. A list of any and all additional fees and expenses likely to be incurred over the term of the contract.

#### IIX. EVALUATION OF THE PROPOSAL

The evaluation is comprised of an analysis of the technical component, a separate calculation of the financial component and a compilation of these scores to arrive at the preferred provider. The evaluation is performed by an Ad Hoc Committee comprised of selected Commission members and the Commission Executive Director. Following evaluation of the proposals, the recommendation of the Committee is referred to the full Commission which retains final approval authority.

All proposals are evaluated on two criteria: technical merit and cost. Technical merit is weighted more heavily than cost, as the experience and quality of the provider is more significant than the cost. The technical component ranking criteria has a maximum score of 70 points, while the max cost score is 30 points, totaling a maximum achievable score of 100 points. The evaluation criteria for both technical and cost are described below.

#### Technical Evaluating Criteria:

Each proposal is rated by each rater for the technical criteria, and an average is then determined for that provider. The criteria are weighted to reflect their importance to the overall importance to the Commission.

Total Technical Points (	per rater):	
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The individual technical score ratings from each rater will be added up and divided by the number of raters to come up with the average technical score for that particular firm. That average is the final Technical Score for that firm.

#### **Evaluation of Cost Component:**

The Cost score is a calculation, not an analysis, and there is only one calculation for each proposal (not one for each rater). The ranking formula uses 30 points as a maximum for the cost portion of the overall evaluation. The formula for cost scores is the following:

(30 points) x (Low Bid Per Hour Cost ÷ Bid Being Evaluated)

#### Example:

Three proposals received (\$150/hr, \$200/hr, \$250/hr). Evaluation of Cost Points is as follows:

Firm A (\$150/hr) = (30) x (150/150) =  $\frac{30 \text{ cost points}}{22.5 \text{ cost points}}$ Firm B (\$200/hr) = (30) x (150/200) =  $\frac{22.5 \text{ cost points}}{22.5 \text{ cost points}}$ 

# Computation of Final Score The final score for each proposal is calculated as Technical Score plus Cost Score. The bidder with the highest overall Final Score will be the Firm recommended to the Full Board of LGPC Commissioners as the Legal Services Provider to the Commission for the stated contract term noted in this IFB.

### **APPENDIX A**

STANDARD CLAUSES FOR NEW YORK STATE CONTRACTS

PLEASE RETAIN THIS DOCUMENT FOR FUTURE REFERENCE.

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#### STANDARD CLAUSES FOR NYS CONTRACTS

The parties to the attached contract, license, lease, amendment or other agreement of any kind (hereinafter, "the contract" or "this contract") agree to be bound by the following clauses which are hereby made a part of the contract (the word "Contractor" herein refers to any party other than the State, whether a contractor, licenser, licensee, lessor, lessee or any other party):

- **1. EXECUTORY CLAUSE.** In accordance with Section 41 of the State Finance Law, the State shall have no liability under this contract to the Contractor or to anyone else beyond funds appropriated and available for this contract.
- 2. NON-ASSIGNMENT CLAUSE. In accordance with Section 138 of the State Finance Law, this contract may not be assigned by the Contractor or its right, title or interest therein assigned, transferred, conveyed, sublet or otherwise disposed of without the State's previous written consent, and attempts to do so are null and void. Notwithstanding the foregoing, such prior written consent of an assignment of a contract let pursuant to Article XI of the State Finance Law may be waived at the discretion of the contracting agency and with the concurrence of the State Comptroller where the original contract was subject to the State Comptroller's approval, where the assignment is due to a reorganization, merger or consolidation of the Contractor's business entity or enterprise. The State retains its right to approve an assignment and to require that any Contractor demonstrate its responsibility to do business with the State. The Contractor may, however, assign its right to receive payments without the State's prior written consent unless this contract concerns Certificates of Participation pursuant to Article 5-A of the State Finance Law.
- 3. COMPTROLLER'S APPROVAL. In accordance with Section 112 of the State Finance Law (or, if this contract is with the State University or City University of New York, Section 355 or Section 6218 of the Education Law), if this contract exceeds \$50,000 (or the minimum thresholds agreed to by the Office of the State Comptroller for certain S.U.N.Y. and C.U.N.Y. contracts), or if this is an amendment for any amount to a contract which, as so amended, exceeds said statutory amount, or if, by this contract, the State agrees to give something other than money when the value or reasonably estimated value of such consideration exceeds \$10,000, it shall not be valid, effective or binding upon the State until it has been approved by the State Comptroller and filed in his office. Comptroller's approval of contracts let by the Office of General Services is required when such contracts exceed \$85,000 (State Finance Law Section 163.6-a). However, such pre-approval shall not be required for any contract established as a centralized contract through the Office of General Services or for a purchase order or other transaction issued under such centralized contract.
- **4.** <u>WORKERS' COMPENSATION BENEFITS.</u> In accordance with Section 142 of the State Finance Law, this

contract shall be void and of no force and effect unless the Contractor shall provide and maintain coverage during the life of this contract for the benefit of such employees as are required to be covered by the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Law.

- **5. NON-DISCRIMINATION REQUIREMENTS.** To the extent required by Article 15 of the Executive Law (also known as the Human Rights Law) and all other State and Federal statutory and constitutional non-discrimination provisions, the Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, sex (including gender identity or expression), national origin, sexual orientation, military status, age, disability, predisposing genetic characteristics, marital status or domestic violence victim status. Furthermore, in accordance with Section 220-e of the Labor Law, if this is a contract for the construction, alteration or repair of any public building or public work or for the manufacture, sale or distribution of materials, equipment or supplies, and to the extent that this contract shall be performed within the State of New York, Contractor agrees that neither it nor its subcontractors shall, by reason of race, creed, color, disability, sex, or national origin: (a) discriminate in hiring against any New York State citizen who is qualified and available to perform the work; or (b) discriminate against or intimidate any employee hired for the performance of work under this contract. If this is a building service contract as defined in Section 230 of the Labor Law. then, in accordance with Section 239 thereof, Contractor agrees that neither it nor its subcontractors shall by reason of race, creed, color, national origin, age, sex or disability: (a) discriminate in hiring against any New York State citizen who is qualified and available to perform the work; or (b) discriminate against or intimidate any employee hired for the performance of work under this contract. Contractor is subject to fines of \$50.00 per person per day for any violation of Section 220-e or Section 239 as well as possible termination of this contract and forfeiture of all moneys due hereunder for a second or subsequent violation.
- 6. WAGE AND HOURS PROVISIONS. If this is a public work contract covered by Article 8 of the Labor Law or a building service contract covered by Article 9 thereof, neither Contractor's employees nor the employees of its subcontractors may be required or permitted to work more than the number of hours or days stated in said statutes, except as otherwise provided in the Labor Law and as set forth in prevailing wage and supplement schedules issued by the State Labor Department. Furthermore, Contractor and its subcontractors must pay at least the prevailing wage rate and pay or provide the prevailing supplements, including the premium rates for overtime pay, as determined by the State Labor Department in accordance with the Labor Law. Additionally, effective April 28, 2008, if this is a public work contract covered by Article 8 of the Labor Law, the Contractor understands and agrees that the filing of payrolls in a manner consistent with Subdivision 3-a of Section 220 of the Labor Law shall be a condition precedent to payment by the State of

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any State approved sums due and owing for work done upon the project.

- 7. NON-COLLUSIVE BIDDING CERTIFICATION. In accordance with Section 139-d of the State Finance Law, if this contract was awarded based upon the submission of bids, Contractor affirms, under penalty of perjury, that its bid was arrived at independently and without collusion aimed at restricting competition. Contractor further affirms that, at the time Contractor submitted its bid, an authorized and responsible person executed and delivered to the State a non-collusive bidding certification on Contractor's behalf.
- 8. INTERNATIONAL BOYCOTT PROHIBITION. In accordance with Section 220-f of the Labor Law and Section 139-h of the State Finance Law, if this contract exceeds \$5,000, the Contractor agrees, as a material condition of the contract, that neither the Contractor nor any substantially owned or affiliated person, firm, partnership or corporation has participated, is participating, or shall participate in an international boycott in violation of the federal Export Administration Act of 1979 (50 USC App. Sections 2401 et seq.) or regulations thereunder. If such Contractor, or any of the aforesaid affiliates of Contractor, is convicted or is otherwise found to have violated said laws or regulations upon the final determination of the United States Commerce Department or any other appropriate agency of the United States subsequent to the contract's execution, such contract, amendment or modification thereto shall be rendered forfeit and void. The Contractor shall so notify the State Comptroller within five (5) business days of such conviction, determination or disposition of appeal (2NYCRR 105.4).
- 9. SET-OFF RIGHTS. The State shall have all of its common law, equitable and statutory rights of set-off. These rights shall include, but not be limited to, the State's option to withhold for the purposes of set-off any moneys due to the Contractor under this contract up to any amounts due and owing to the State with regard to this contract, any other contract with any State department or agency, including any contract for a term commencing prior to the term of this contract, plus any amounts due and owing to the State for any other reason including, without limitation, tax delinquencies, fee delinquencies or monetary penalties relative thereto. The State shall exercise its set-off rights in accordance with normal State practices including, in cases of set-off pursuant to an audit, the finalization of such audit by the State agency, its representatives, or the State Comptroller.
- 10. <u>RECORDS</u>. The Contractor shall establish and maintain complete and accurate books, records, documents, accounts and other evidence directly pertinent to performance under this contract (hereinafter, collectively, "the Records"). The Records must be kept for the balance of the calendar year in which they were made and for six (6) additional years thereafter. The State Comptroller, the Attorney General and any other person or entity authorized to conduct an examination, as well as the agency or agencies involved in this

contract, shall have access to the Records during normal business hours at an office of the Contractor within the State of New York or, if no such office is available, at a mutually agreeable and reasonable venue within the State, for the term specified above for the purposes of inspection, auditing and copying. The State shall take reasonable steps to protect from public disclosure any of the Records which are exempt from disclosure under Section 87 of the Public Officers Law (the "Statute") provided that: (i) the Contractor shall timely inform an appropriate State official, in writing, that said records should not be disclosed; and (ii) said records shall be sufficiently identified; and (iii) designation of said records as exempt under the Statute is reasonable. Nothing contained herein shall diminish, or in any way adversely affect, the State's right to discovery in any pending or future litigation.

- 11. IDENTIFYING INFORMATION AND PRIVACY NOTIFICATION. (a) Identification Number(s). Every invoice or New York State Claim for Payment submitted to a New York State agency by a payee, for payment for the sale of goods or services or for transactions (e.g., leases, easements, licenses, etc.) related to real or personal property must include the payee's identification number. The number is any or all of the following: (i) the payee's Federal employer identification number, (ii) the payee's Federal social security number, and/or (iii) the payee's Vendor Identification Number assigned by the Statewide Financial System. Failure to include such number or numbers may delay payment. Where the payee does not have such number or numbers, the payee, on its invoice or Claim for Payment, must give the reason or reasons why the payee does not have such number or numbers.
- (b) Privacy Notification. (1) The authority to request the above personal information from a seller of goods or services or a lessor of real or personal property, and the authority to maintain such information, is found in Section 5 of the State Tax Law. Service hereunder shall be complete upon Contractor's actual receipt of process or upon the State's receipt of the return thereof by the United States Postal Service as refused or undeliverable. Contractor must promptly notify the State, in writing, of each and every change of address to which service of process can be made. Service by the State to the last known address shall be sufficient. Contractor will have thirty (30) calendar days after service hereunder is complete in which to respond.
- **18. PROHIBITION ON PURCHASE OF TROPICAL HARDWOODS.** The Contractor certifies and warrants that all wood products to be used under this contract award will be in accordance with, but not limited to, the specifications and provisions of Section 165 of the State Finance Law, (Use of Tropical Hardwoods) which prohibits purchase and use of tropical hardwoods, unless specifically exempted, by the State or any governmental agency or political subdivision or public benefit corporation. Qualification for an exemption under this law will be the responsibility of the contractor to establish to meet with the approval of the State.
