## STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PERMIT JURISDICTIONAL REQUEST

For projects located in the Towns of Fort Ann, Dresden, Hague, Putnam and Ticonderoga

The Commission has established Stormwater Management Regulations for construction and clearing projects within the Park. A permit from the Commission is required prior to undertaking these activities within the Towns of Hague, Putnam, Ticonderoga, Dresden and Fort Ann. To determine if your project requires a permit please complete this form and submit it to the above address. This is not a required form, however, jurisdictional inquiries must be in writing.

If you are in the Town of Bolton, Queensbury or Lake George or Lake George Village, contact the zoning administrator of that municipality for permit requirements.
