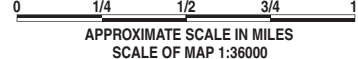

ARE YOU REGISTERED TO BOAT?

Registration fees are established by State law for docks, boats, and moorings. You are required to register for use on Lake George any mechanically powered vessel of 10 horsepower or more, and any non-mechanically powered vessel greater than 18 feet in length. Vessel lengths can be determined by NYS DMV registered length.

Display of registration decal is required. Registrations are available at many locations around the lake including: launches, convenient stores, bait and tackle shops and municipal offices as well as from the LGPC office*. Most registration agents are open daily. Inquire at a marina or call the LGPC office. It is not required to register before coming to Lake George; however, you may do so by contacting the LGPC. Registration fees are as follows:

1 day	\$7.50
1 week	\$11.25
